

CAVE ART-PINE NEEDLE COILING

SUPPLY LIST

- small gourd that sits flat, a cannonball gourd or the bottom off of a bottle gourd work well, the top opening should be 3.5 to 4.5 inches anything larger is difficult for beginners to finish in the time allotted for this class
- black acrylic paint for the interior, Apple Barrel Gloss works well it has a nice shine, however any black acrylic or your choice of color will work
- long leaf pine needles, you can purchase these on Ebay, www.turtlefeathers.com , www.caningshop.com or you may have a favorite supplier
- tapestry needle, these are a blunt ended needle that can be purchased at an sewing store/department. I prefer the blunt end as it does not break the pine needles
- black artificial sinew, you may purchase this at www.turtlefeathers.com, www.tandy.com, or www.caningshop.com and at leather craft stores, you may use any color you like, I have used black.
- scissors
- electric drill and a 1/32 bit or size that your needle will fit through the whole, you can use an awl, it is a bit harder to use than a drill and bit, however it will work, you can purchase an awl at www.caningshop.com, they have a very nice sharp one. I have two and use them all the time.
- measuring tape preferably a cloth measuring tape the type you use for sewing
- mini jig saw
- pencil, I prefer a white charcoal pencil it is very easy to erase
- small seed bead
- tissue paper or tracing paper
- Artists tape or masking tape
- Gilders Paste rust, sandalwood, and orange
- wood burner with a writing tip and shading tip or Faber Castell black pen, available at all Art stores
- soft cloth cut into 4-6" squares
